



He used to canoe down the Des Plaines River and swim as a lifeguard Pensacola water is prompt-ing Kristian Anders Gustavson to venture to the massive oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico.

Gustavson is in New Orleans to begin documenting the effects of the BP oil spill that is spew-
